#### <u>A Word from Bro. Mark –</u>

You can see the logo on the sign and instantly know the company. In some parts of the country a green brontosaurus marked it's location. In other parts of the country it could be identified by a yellow sea shell. In my hometown, it was a red star that showed you the way. If you haven't guessed by now the companies were Sinclair gas, a Shell station and .....Texaco. You could trust your car to the man with the Star! Those logos, signs and slogan were all part of a process called branding. Branding is a big word in the business and church world today. Basically, the concept for branding is deliberately portraying the image publicly that you want people to think about your company or church. If you had to tell someone what the "brand" of FBC Many is, what would it be? Most church members have a hard time articulating a clear presentation of the purpose, principles and projected future hopes of their church. The reasons for hesitation are many. However, the most common reason for inability to communicate the values and vision of a church is lack of communication from the leadership. This is not intentional. Church is a busy place and we are often guided by a calendar and events and human circumstances beyond our control. Recently, a bulletin insert was distributed to communicate the values of FBC Many. If you didn't see it, it would be good to get your hands on a copy and think those values through. It will help you see, say and understand what your fellow believers care about and where the church stands on important issues.

A gas station sign isn't really the first thing I think of when I hear the word "branding". I think of cattle being marked with a fiery hot iron to indicate ownership. Christians aren't branded literally like a young cow joining the heard. However, we are branded by behavior. John 13:35 says, "by this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another". If you want a short way to tell people the brand of your church, try this. "Our church loves Jesus and the people he made and we can't wait to tell people how to know Him".
