Notes from the Pastor Search Committee:

Dear Church Family,

Grace and peace to all in the name of Jesus our Savior!

As Jesus went into Capernaum, a centurion came up to Him, begging Him [for help], and saying, "Lord, my servant is lying at home paralyzed, with intense and terrible, tormenting pain." Jesus said to him, "I will come and heal him." But the centurion replied to Him, "Lord, I am not worthy to have You come under my roof, but only say the word, and my servant will be healed. For I also am a man subject to authority [of a higher rank], with soldiers subject to me; and I say to one, 'Go!' and he goes, and to another, 'Come!' and he comes, and to my slave, 'Do this!' and he does it." When Jesus heard this, He was amazed and said to those who were following Him, "I tell you truthfully, I have not found such great faith [as this] with anyone in Israel. Matt 8:5-10 (AMP)

In New Testament times, a Roman centurion was a professional military officer commanding a platoon of troops called a 'century'. Their importance was based on seniority, with the senior centurion being in a position of great prestige and very high in the chain of command. The Bible mentions several Roman centurions, with this one who approached Jesus for healing on behalf of his servant possibly of higher rank. For these men to make a request of anyone, let alone Jesus, a Jew, would have required great faith and humility. Even stating he was not worthy to have Jesus under his roof, "but only say the word". Two times in the gospels Jesus Christ stated that certain individuals had "great faith". In both cases the individuals with "great faith" were non-Israelites. Showing us, the faith that pleases God is not reserved for the religious crowd, but anyone who trust and believes can be transformed from death to life through the Gospel of Jesus Christ by grace through faith. The centurion's faith "amazed" Jesus. His trust in God's Word should challenge us to focus on what faith truly is. The centurion also understood Jesus' Word held authority to heal without physical touch. Believing Christ represented GOD, therefore in the chain of command that comes from God the Father. So. by his faith, he believed what GOD said.

An important lesson to learn from these passages is that God's goodness, mercy, and faithfulness is not subject to our limitations or perceptions of what HE can or will not do. Jesus asks us to have a child-like faith; trusting in Him without overthinking. We must trust that God's Word is sufficient, very capable, and we have it! Please remember, when God reveals to us our new Pastor there may be changes that require us to take steps of great faith in humility. The centurion believed beyond what he could see or even rationalize. He humbled himself and simply trusted the Word of God! One has to wonder could Jesus say he was "amazed" of our personal faith in Him?
