

Notes from the Pastor Search Committee:

Church Family,

Grace and peace to all in the name of Jesus our Savior!

For whoever wishes to save his life [in this world] will [eventually] lose it [through death], but whoever loses his life [in this world] for My sake will find it [that is, life with Me for all eternity]. For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world [wealth, fame, success], but forfeits his soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul? Matthew 16:25-26 (AMP)

Sadly, we sometimes see this world as having everything we need for a happy and fulfilled life. Desiring a life of ease, a life of comfort, a life devoid of troubles and sickness; often doing all we can to accomplish these things in this life at the expense of the next. In the beginning that was so (Genesis 1:29-31); however, when man sinned he put self on the throne of his life in place of God. We are commanded to lay up treasure in heaven and not seek after the pleasures and comforts of this world. None of which can be had without salvation through Christ Jesus. Whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life because of Christ will find it. Jim Elliot, a missionary martyred for the sake of Christ once said, "He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain what he cannot lose."

In our journey through this life may we heed the gravity of Jesus's teaching about the choices faced by every individual regarding their life's priorities. These verses serve as a stark reminder that life's luxuries and achievements, though enticing, cannot compare to the soul's eternal worth. The ultimate question remains: what are we willing to exchange for our souls?

As Christ identified with us and became sin for us so we might be made the righteousness of GOD in Him and live a life that says: *This world though sometimes difficult, is temporary, but my eternal soul was worth the blood of the Son of the living GOD!* Please continue to pray that our committee remains focused on HIS way and not get distracted or enticed by worldly views in accomplishing our assignment.
