Notes from the Pastor Search Committee:

Church Family,

Grace and peace to all in the name of Jesus our Savior!

So Jacob was left alone, and a Man [came and] wrestled with him until daybreak. When the Man saw that He had not prevailed against Jacob, He touched his hip joint; and Jacob's hip was dislocated as he wrestled with Him. Genesis 32:24-25 (AMP)

Webster's definition of surrender implies a giving up after a struggle to retain or resist. God's word is filled with examples of how living apart from a surrendered relationship with Him is contrary to why He created us. After years of being away Jacob set out to return to his home and hoped to make peace with his brother Esau. One night on the journey, he sent everyone ahead of him while he stayed behind. While alone Jacob wrestles (struggles) with God and himself. Jacob's desire is for a place of blessing, a place of peace, a place where he could go forward surrendered to God's control. To surrender to God's way, path, and plan for his life no matter what lay ahead. The passage here shows that until Jacob had a divine wrestling match, a very personal struggle with God, his faith was not cemented - surrendered, as was the faith of his father Isaac and grandfather Abraham. Before this we read, Jacob said, "O God of my father Abraham and God of my father Isaac, the LORD, who said to me, 'Return to your country and to your people, and I will make you prosper,' Gen 32:9 (AMP) Is it significant that Jacob refers to God as "God of Abraham and God of Issac" and not of himself? Jacob wanted God's blessing but struggled with his choice to fully surrender to Him in faith.

Throughout His word, and more significantly our lives, God will reveal himself in ways that give us a clear vision of who He is and how we fit in His plan. He is a God of transformation, the author of peace and not of confusion. However, we most certainly will all come (alone) to a place of struggle where we wrestle with God for a blessing and overwhelming sense of peace in our current circumstance. A place where our faith is tested and hopefully completely surrendered to Him. A place in our walk that no matter what this life brings us we can say "He is my God and I trust Him completely!" A place where I know He has seen me through before and He will see me through again. I know from that day forward I will not be the same person that I once was. I will find myself in a new season of testing. A place in time where my walk was changed. A new day where I am completely surrendered to the will of my Father. *Now the sun rose on him as he passed Penuel (Peniel), and he was limping because of his hip.* Gen 32:31 (*AMP*)

Just as God changed Jacob (Israel) both physically and spiritually, and his walk was different.

We sincerely thank you for your prayers of wisdom and discernment in completing our task. May our vision continually be more focused on seeing things from God's perspective and not ours. *I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you. Job* 42:5 (ESV)
