

Such key items include the proposed job description for Music Director as well as the discussion of revising the 2025 Church Budget to reflect this job. Proposed Job Description & 2025 Church Budget Revisions due to Music Minister Position

The Personnel and Music Committees have created a revised Job Description for the Music Minister position. Sermon Notes:

Notes from the Pastor Search Committee:

Church Family,

In Acts we read how a group of believers were spreading the gospel in Phoenicia, Cyprus, and Antioch speaking mostly to Jews, but in Antioch to the Gentiles and many were converted.

Acts 11:19-24 "Now those who had been scattered by persecution that broke out when Stephen was killed traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus and Antioch, spreading the word only to Jews. Some of them, however, men from Cyprus and Cyrene, when to Antioch and began to speak to Greeks also, telling them the good news about the Lord Jesus. The Lord's hand was with them, and a great number of people were brought to the Lord.

News of this reached the church of Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. When he arrived and saw what the grace of God had done, he was glad and encouraged them all to remain true to the Lord with all their hearts. He was a good man, full of the Holly Spirit and faith and a great number of people were brought to the Lord."

Barnabas pleased with growth saw a need for more leadership so he went to Tarsus to bring Saul (Paul) to Antioch. Barnabas saw Antioch as a Gentile church that could be the base operation for Paul's mission to the Gentiles, the two taught there for a year. Because the hand of the Lord them was with them a great number who believed turned to Lord.

While every church should have a fulltime pastor, a healthy body of believers can continue to make disciples and function as they should in the absence of a pastor. The hand of the Lord can work in a mighty way through a thriving church that has been blessed with a gifted leader as was the case in Antioch.

Churches sometimes struggle to find a fulltime pastor, but, as helped by leadership and its church in the body of Christ, the Lord will bless His church with a needed pastor just as he did in Antioch.
